MATHS

Written/Mental Methods and Measurement

This half term, we will continue to secure our knowledge of key facts and skills in Mathematics.

Our Objectives will be to:

- To consolidate mental and written methods for all four operations, applying these to problem solving and word problems.
- Measure, compare, add and subtract lengths (m/cm) mass (kg/g) and volume/capacity (l/ml)
- Add and subtract amounts of money to give change, using both £ and p in practical contexts
- Tell and write the time from an analogue clock, including using Roman numerals from I to XII, and 12-hour
- Estimate and read time to the nearest minute; record and compare time in terms of seconds, minutes and hours.

HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

Local Study - Edmondsley

We will be studying the history of our local area focusing on the coal mining of fossil fuels.

Our Objectives will be to:

- Use maps and atlases to observe and compare the past and present human and physical features of the local areas.
- Understand the types of settlement and land use.
- Learn about the economic activity of the local area including trade links and the distribution of coal.
- Understand the effect of fossil fuels to the environment.
