We will be writing letters and our own books linked to our topic of growing. Our poetry will also focus on nature.

Our Objectives will be to:

- Re-read what has been written to check it makes sense
- Make simple changes to writing where suggested
- Begin to use question marks and exclamation marks in writing
- Use and to join words and clauses
- Use some descriptive language

MATHS

This term we will be building upon and applying know calculations to cross over 100 and beyond. Children will understand place value in greater depth.

Our Objectives will be to:

- Count on and back in ones to 100 and know 1 more, 1 less, 10 more and 10 less
- Understand hundreds, tens and 1s place value
- Add and subtract single digit numbers to two-digit numbers
- Learning pairs and doubles
- Compare weights and capacities
- Complete block graphs
- Find fractions of numbers

MUSIC

Seasons

Our Music focus will be to develop further their vocabulary and understanding of pitch movements, exploring pitch through singing, tuned percussion and listening games.

Our Objectives will be to:

- Identify changes in pitch and respond to them with movement
- Contrast changes in pitch with changes in dynamics
- Relate pitch changes to graphic symbols and performing pitch changes vocally
- Listen and respond to pitch changes with movement

GEOGRAPHY

We Are Britain - Mountains & Major Hills

We will be taking an aerial trip around Great Britain and discovering the main mountains and major hill summits in each country.

Our Objectives will be to:

- Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the UK its surrounding seas.
- Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features and key human features.
- Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognize landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key.

SCIENCE

What's growing in our gardens?

We will be designing and making our own Garden Centre both inside and outside the classroom. We will be planting seeds and learning about the lifecycle of plants. We have already planted potatoes and plan to eat these at the end of term!

Our Objectives will be to:

- Identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees
- Identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees
