- Appreciate and understand a wide range of highquality live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musician
- Play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression

GEOGRAPHY

River Wear

During topic lessons we will be studying the water cycle and how rivers form with a focus on the River Wear. We also intend to include a field study of the Wear.

Our Objectives will be to:

- Describe key aspects of the water cycle and rivers.
- Use fieldwork to observe, measure, record and present the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods, including sketch maps, plans and graphs, and digital technologies.
- Use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied.
- Use the 8 points of a compass, 4 and 6-figure grid references, symbols and key (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps) to build their knowledge of the United Kingdom and the wider world

MATHS

Decimals/Roman Numerals/Measures/Shapes

Our Objectives will be to:

- Develop competence in division and multiplication.
- Solve problems (one and two step) using all four operations including decimals and fractions.
- Develop understanding of measures including area and perimeter.
- Compare and classify shapes 2D and 3D.
