What to expect from a Governor

A Governor is a representative, but not a delegate

As parents, you may share your opinions and views on the school to a Parent Governor. However, it is not a parent governors' responsibility to change the day to day running of a school or suggest events. Governors have a strategic role which often involves policy making. It is not a day to day operational role deciding what happens during the day or future events.

Majority Rules

Do not expect Parent Governors to have overall responsibility. We have a **Governing Body**. Strategic decisions are made after discussion and a vote.

Not the place for individual complaints

Please do not take individual concerns you have about your own children or friends' to Parent Governors. Parent Governors do not have the responsibility to respond to individual issues. Parent Governors' role with the Governing Body is to make sure policies are fit for purpose and these are communicated well to everyone.

Confidentiality

Parent Governors will not disclose to parents any confidential matters. Please do not place parent governors in this position.

Edmondsley has a strong commitment to supporting an arts and culturally rich curriculum. This is supported by whole school arts planning, arts delivery in and out of school, by both teaching staff and local artists, and underpinned by the School Council for pupil voice, pupil engagement in showcasing (such as the art exhibition).
