





Home Learning Grid

Try and complete one activity from each section (column) every day (Mon- Fri).

<u>Sound 'ai'</u> Can you say the sounds in these 'ai' words: snail, train, rain, tail. Can you think of anymore words with the ai sound in them? Now have a go at writing the words.	<u>Paper aeroplane competition</u> Make a paper aeroplane each and then starting from the same place throw them and see which one travels furthest. Try to find a way to measure and record the distances travelled.	<u>Lay the table for dinner</u> How many people are there? How many knives and forks and cups do you need? Can you write a name card to show each person where to sit?	<u>Make a joy jar</u> Decorate an empty pot or jar and then draw a picture of one thing that has made you joyful that day and put it into your jar. The happy memories will soon start to build up!
<u>Name writing</u> Practise writing your name with correct letter formation! If you can already do this have a go at your middle and last name too.	<u>Toy sorting</u> Sort some of your toys into two groups and see if people in your family can guess your 'rule' eg blue and not blue or wheels and no wheels etc	<u>Family portraits</u> Draw pictures of people in your family or maybe make models of them using playdough or empty toilet roll tubes	<u>Play hide and seek as a family</u>
<u>Practise letter formation</u> This week practise the curly caterpillar letters c, a, o, g, d, e, s, using correct letter formation Use pens, pencils or paints indoors or chalks or water and brushes outside	<u>Number recognition</u> Write the numbers to 10 or 20 on pieces of paper and lay them out on the floor. Ask a grown up to call out a number and quickly go and stand on it. Maybe you might have to put 2 hands on the next number called or an elbow on the next etc	<u>Create a new pet for your family</u> Maybe you could paint a rock to look like a pet or maybe you could use items from your recycling bin to make your pet. What type of pet will it be? A spider? A dog? Or something else?	<u>Make a family band</u> Find some empty containers add some pasta, rice or anything else you have in your house and seal them up. Now choose a favourite song and sing and play along to it as a family.
<u>Write a sentence</u> Can you write a sentence which starts 'I can see...' about this picture.  Or draw a picture just like it and label it using the initial letter of each object that you can see.	<u>Number bonds</u> Before school closed we were learning about numbers which add up to make 5 and 10. Count out either 5 or 10 objects and use them to help you draw some part whole models (like pictures) to show ways to make these numbers. 	<u>Look at some pictures of when you were a baby and a toddler</u> What can you do now that you couldn't do then? What would you like to do when you are grown up? Can your parents find any pictures of when they were little to show you?	<u>Build a den</u> Use a blanket, towel or duvet and perhaps some chairs or the table to create a den somewhere in your house. Once it's finished go inside and share a favourite book together.
<u>Tricky words</u> Can you learn to read and write tricky word you You might like to watch the tricky word song on you tube too: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=R0871YrRpgY	<u>Addition</u> Make two groups of objects. Carefully count them to find out how many altogether. Can you write the number sentence to show this eg 3 + 5 = 8	<u>Complete an act of kindness</u> Maybe offer someone in your family a hug or water a plant.	<u>Play a board game as a family</u> Choose a favourite game (or maybe you have one in the cupboard you've never even played yet!) and have some fun.
