







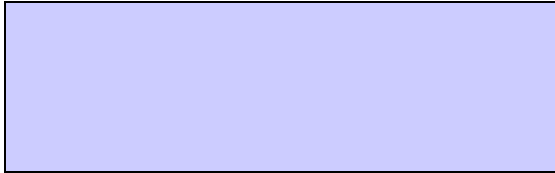
Home Learning Grid
