<p>This week is Children's Book Week. Choose your favourite book, snuggle up with an adult and read it together. Talk about the different characters and events and ask each other lots of questions.</p>	<p>Play Multiplication Bingo (best played in pairs/groups) Choose a times table to practise and write down the multiplication questions onto separate pieces of paper, i.e 1 x 5, 2 x 5 etc. and fold them up. Create your bingo card by writing 5 numbers, which are multiples of the chosen table i.e 5, 15, 30 etc. Take turns picking question and reading out. If you have the answer to the question on your board, cross it out. The first person to cross them all out is the winner! Don't forget to shout BINGO!</p>	<p>Mrs Webb and I are loving watching the Great British Sewing Bee (separately). Can you recycle an item of old clothing and make it into something new? Maybe you could turn a t-shirt into a bag or a sock into a door stop? The possibilities are endless! We can't wait to see what you come up with.</p>	<p>Go on a Scavenger hunt! Before going out for a walk (or complete in your house/garden) decide on 5 things you are going to look for whilst out for example; a dandelion, an oak tree leaf, a magpie, etc. and create your own checklists - you may even include pictures! The first one to get everything on the list wins!</p>
<p>Find out about your favourite author. Some books include information at the front of the book, or if you can look online. Create a fact file about your author, can you draw the front cover of your favourite book?</p>	<p>Using your coins, come up with as many different ways as possible to make £1. How many different ways did you find?</p>	<p>Do a Joe Wicks PE lesson work-out. These can be found on the Body Coach YouTube channel daily at 9am or you can catch up later. Or make a workout of your own! What exercises might you include?</p>	<p>Create your own creature from junk! Use items from your recycling bin, unwanted parts of toys or even special items you have found when out walking or in the garden.</p>
<p>Turn a short story into a play script, or write a short play of your own. Can you act it out to other people? You may even want to create little puppets for each of your characters as playing all of the parts yourself might be quite tricky!</p>	<p>The 24 Game Using a pack of playing cards (numbers only), select 4 number cards at random from the pile. Find a way to manipulate the 4 digits using any of the 4 operations (+, -, x, ÷) so the end result is 24! For example, if you chose 4, 7, 8, 8, you could do $(7 - (8 \div 8)) \times 4 = 24$</p>	<p>May 6th marks the start of National Sun Awareness Week. Design a poster to inform others of how to keep safe in the sun and why this is important!</p>	<p>Play Pictionary! With your family come up with a selection of different things to draw (animals, objects, places, etc) and write these on separate cards/pieces of paper. Then take it in turns to draw the card you selected and let the others see if they can guess correctly! Keep score and see who wins.</p>
<p>(You may need your junk model for this activity) Write about your special creature. Describe its appearance, personality, habitat, likes and dislikes. Draw and label a picture of your creature so everyone knows what each part can do!</p>	<p>Ask your adults for some coins or raid your piggy bank. Can you identify what each coin is worth? Use 3 coins at a time to make different combinations. What is the highest combination you can make? What is the lowest?</p>	<p>Get sketching! Find a photograph or picture of a person, place or object and sketch it.</p>	<p>Host a quiz. Come up with a range of questions and answers then take the role of host and ask your family the questions. At the end read out the answers, the person with the highest score wins.</p>
<p>Choose a small toy and take it on a journey around your home, think of all the different places you could put your toy. Write a short piece of writing about your toy, including a range of different prepositions to describe where your toy went.</p>	<p>Closest to 100. Using a pack of playing cards (numbers only), each player must select 3 number cards at random from the pile. Using any of the 4 operations (+, -, x, ÷) manipulate your numbers to get as close to 100 as you can. The player with the number closest to 100 wins that round.</p>	<p>Friday 8th May is VE Day. Speak to your family (maybe phone call grandparents), or use the internet if you can to research VE Day. What is it? Why do we celebrate it? Think of ways you and your family can celebrate - maybe you could make bunting and decorate the house, bake a cake or have a picnic (in your garden or living room!)</p>	<p>Mrs Webb and I have had extra time to do chores around the house. Do some chores with your family; can you Hoover? Sort laundry? Maybe you could sort clothes and toys in your bedroom and decide which you might donate to charity shops once they open up again? I like to put music on while I'm completing chore, why not put your music on and sing a long while you work?</p>
