<p><u>Read a story from around the world</u> If you have a copy of 'Handa's Surprise' on your bookshelf then read that together or find it here <a href="https://safeyoutube.net/w/pDV5">https://safeyoutube.net/w/pDV5</a></p>	<p><u>Subtraction stories.</u> Use objects from around your home to generate some subtraction stories. Eg I have 5 biscuits. I eat one. How many are left? Choose amounts within 5 / 10 or 20</p>	<p><u>Where in the world?</u> Does anybody in your wider family live in a different part of the world? Try to find out about what life is like there.</p>	<p><u>Read another story from around the world</u> Have a look on your bookshelf. Have you got any other stories which are set in different countries around the world? If so choose one to read together.</p>
<p><u>Describe Handa's Fruits</u> Draw a picture of the fruits in Handa's basket. Underneath write 'In Handa's basket there were'... ripe red mangos, soft yellow bananas, round juicy oranges' etc How many can you remember?</p>	<p><u>Complete some subtraction number sentences</u> Write out some simple subtraction sums for your child to complete. Keep the numbers within either 5, 10 or 20. Using objects to support, encourage your child to complete the sums. Eg <math>10 - 2 =</math></p>	<p><u>Make a paper plate mask</u> Use a paper plate and create a mask to represent one of the animals from the story. Eg add black stripes to be the zebra or add 2 big ears and a trunk for the elephant.</p>	<p><u>Play hot potato</u> Sit in a circle and pass a ball or beanbag around the circle as fast as you can. When the music stops the person holding the object is out. The winner is the last person left in.</p>
<p><u>Play splat the letter</u> Write out some single letters or digraphs onto pieces of paper and spread them out on the floor. Try to choose ones you need to practise. Say one of the letters and your child has to 'splat' that letter with their hand as quick as they can. If the weather is nice, you could take this game outside and play with a water pistol instead.</p>	<p><u>Count backwards</u> Practise counting back from either 10 or 20 Can your child say the number which is one less than a number said at random eg what is one less than 12? One less than 15? Etc If you want a challenge try to say the number two less than a given number, but that's really tricky!!</p>	<p><u>Flags from around the world</u> Look at these flags from around the world. <a href="https://www.worldometers.info/geography/flags-of-the-world/">https://www.worldometers.info/geography/flags-of-the-world/</a> Can you find the flag of the UK? Choose one of the flags to copy or make one up of your own.</p>	<p><u>Play Monkey says</u> A bit like Simon says, but give commands to make animal sounds or moves Eg Monkey says 'run like a cheetah' or 'squeal like a chimp' etc</p>
<p><u>Word building</u> Have a look at a globe or map of the world. Identify GB then try to find Africa where Handa's Surprise is set. Read out some names of countries. Can your child say the sounds in the words eg Spain - S-p-ai-n If you want a challenge try to write the names of some of the countries too.</p>	<p><u>Play the box game</u> Count toys one at a time into a box, so they cannot be seen. Ask: "Can you show on your fingers how many are hidden?" Remove 1 or 2 toys from the box, without showing the objects inside, now ask your child to show on their fingers, "How many are there left?" Count to check and repeat with other amounts.</p>	<p><u>Taste some fruits</u> Next time you go shopping maybe your mam could get one of the fruits from Handa's basket for you to taste. Or maybe there is a fruit already in the fruit bowl that you have never tasted...Why not give it a try!</p>	<p><u>Play Guess your animal game</u> Tape a picture of an animal onto someone's back. You have to ask questions which can only be answered yes or no and try to guess what the animal is. Eg Does my animal have a trunk? Does my animal have stripes?</p>
<p><u>Reading words</u> Play Odd and Bob here <a href="https://www.phonicsbloom.com/uk/game/odd-and-bob?phase=2">https://www.phonicsbloom.com/uk/game/odd-and-bob?phase=2</a> Your child must sort real and fake words by sounding out the words on the screen.</p>	<p><u>Write some number sentences</u> Today tell some subtraction stories eg I have 8 bananas. I eat 1. How many are left? Help your child to write the story as a number sentence eg <math>8 - 1 = 7</math> Use objects to support the calculations.</p>	<p><u>Complete an act of kindness</u> This week try to say something kind to a brother or sister or maybe give your family pet an extra cuddle.</p>	<p><u>Learn some different languages</u> Can you learn to say 'thank you' in 3 different languages from around the world.</p>
