<p><u>Watch Go Jettters Rainforest</u> Talk about where the tree frog was found? What sound did it make? Which rainforest insect steals the picnic? What happens when the tree frogs aren't there to eat the ants? https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b07ff060/go-jettters-series-1-19-amazon-rainforest-south-america</p>	<p><u>2d shape pictures.</u> Draw around objects to create 2d shapes then cut them out and arrange them to create a 2d shape picture of a robot. Talk about the properties of the shapes and not just their names eg are the sides straight or curved? How many pointy corners?</p>	<p><u>Find out about rainforests</u> Watch this video clip about some animals in the rainforests. What facts can you remember? Which animals made the most noise? https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p011mww</p>	<p><u>Make a garden trail</u> Either in your garden or out on a walk use sticks as arrows and make trails for each other to follow. Use the language of direction eg forwards, back, left, right etc as you move around your trail.</p>
<p><u>Make an alliterative sentence</u> Choose a rainforest animal eg a monkey. Draw a picture of your animal and then create a sentence about it where each word begins with the same letter eg mad, munching monkey. If you can, try to write your sentence as well as saying it.</p>	<p><u>Go on a shape hunt</u> How many different shapes can you find around your house? Introduce names for common 3d shapes - cylinders, spheres, cones, cubes, cuboids</p>	<p><u>Make an explorers outfit</u> Make your own explorers outfit find a backpack, sun hat and make a pair of binoculars. Wear your outfit next time you go out for a walk. What did you see?</p>	<p><u>Play a game of I spy</u></p>
<p><u>Practise letter formation</u> Choose some letters (or numbers) you find tricky to practise then use the link below https://www.doorwayonline.org.uk/activities/letterformation/ Finally write the letters as neatly as you can with pencil and paper.</p>	<p><u>Sing shape songs</u> Use these links and join in with the 2d and 3d shape songs https://safeyoutube.net/w/sGX5 https://safeyoutube.net/w/RHX5</p>	<p><u>Create a rainforest animal picture</u> Draw, paint, collage or junk model a rainforest animal. Take a picture and email it to school for me to see!</p>	<p><u>Alphabet hunt</u> Try to find something for every letter of the alphabet from around your house and garden. Can you get everything to fit on a tray?</p>
<p><u>Word building</u> Collect 5 (or more) objects from around your house / garden. Say the sounds you can hear in these words eg ch-air (chair) Then try to write your words. Spellings should be phonetically plausible attempts.</p>	<p><u>Sort shapes</u> Collect a selection of 3d shape objects eg bottles, tubes boxes etc. Sort them into sets to show roll / don't roll. Can you spot any 2d shapes on the objects?</p>	<p><u>Listen to this song</u> Listen to this song about saving the rainforest https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yrcU514z6nM</p>	<p><u>Have some exercise</u> Decide on an exercise move for each number on a dice. Take turns to roll the dice and get moving!</p>
<p><u>Tricky word reading</u> Make flashcards and then read these tricky words: I, no, go, to, the, into, he, she, me, we, be. How quick can you be? Try to spot them in books around your house too.</p>	<p><u>Double some numbers</u> Roll a dice then double the number you get and try to write an addition sentence to match eg 3+ 3 = 6 If you want a challenge write some doubles for numbers to double 10 or even beyond.</p>	<p><u>Complete an act of kindness</u> Maybe this week you could do someone a favour or offer someone a compliment.</p>	<p><u>Learn some different languages</u> Try to learn how to say 'hello' in at least 3 different languages</p>
