Plant some seeds. Find out what you will need to do in order to make sure your seeds grow.	Have a game of bowling. Line up some objects that are not easily broken, roll a ball towards them and see how many you knock down!
How did Jack's Mam feel when Jack showed her the magic beans that he had? Can you draw a picture of her angry face?	When you go out for a walk, compare different sizes of plants. What is the tallest plant that you can find?	Can you move like a giant? How loud can you stamp your feet? Maybe try this activity outside! Can you practise saying 'fee-fi-fo-fum', see how fast you can say it! What is the initial sound that you can hear in each of the words? Try clapping each time you say a word.	Use a ruler or a tape measure to measure some objects in your house. Find the smallest item that you can and find the biggest item that you can.	Talk about whether Jack should have stolen the gold? Was it a good thing to do?	Bake a cake!
Draw a picture of Jack and the giant.	Count how many: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pink beans</li> <li>• Orange beans</li> <li>• Blue beans</li> </ul> there are. 	Plants need water to grow, can you measure how much rain falls this week? You could place a bucket or a tub outside and check it each day to see whether more water has been collected. Put some shaving foam onto a tray and enjoy some messy play. Can you make giant handprints in the foam? What does it feel like? I wonder if the clouds in the story feel similar to the shaving foam?	Can you draw a beanstalk with 5 leaves?	Ask an adult to boil some eggs. Can you have an egg and spoon race?	Play snap with a deck of cards.
