Read 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' or watch it online at <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0gyl6ykDwds">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0gyl6ykDwds</a>	Design a home for the bear to live in. You can use some blocks, recycling, or anything you have available. Where do you think he might like to live, in a cave? In a house? In the woods?	Go on your very own bear hunt, who will play the bear?	Have a go at the weekly challenge that will be set on Facebook.
See if you can read the story a few times over the week. Can you remember key parts of the story? Can you repeat the repeated phrases?	Can you draw a small teddy bear, a medium sized teddy bear and a big teddy bear? Does this remind you of another story?	Can you move like the children in the story? Can you tip toe and pretend that you are splashing through a river?	Do some research - how many different types of bears are there? Which is the biggest? Where do the bears live?

Have a try of this teddy bear game: <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/teddy-numbers">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/teddy-numbers</a>	If you have any musical instruments, can you play them to the movements in the story? E.g. play quietly when the children are tip-toeing and loud when they are splashing through water.	Have a teddy bears picnic, this can be in real life or just in role play! Can you write an invitation to your teddy bear?
In a tray, add some sand or flour, pretend it is the river from the story. Can you make some waves with your finger?	Ask an adult to cut a potato in half, dip the potato in some paint, can you print the paint onto paper and make a bear?	Put on your wellies and find a muddy puddle to splash in!	Watch Mr Tumble on CBeebies - Can you learn a new Makaton sign?
Open the book on any page you like, play a game of I spy, saying the initial sound of anything that you can see on that particular page.	Play a game of hide and seek, pretend you are the bear and growl as loud as you can when you are found! Remember to count to 10 and no peeking!	Listen to the different sounds that your feet make as you go on a walk, what does it sound like when you are walking on grass? Or through leaves? Or just on the path?	Why not use some old material to make a new outfit for your teddy bear!
