Read 'Duck in the truck'. If you don't have I at home, you can watch it at: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=pICm8 MigUQI	Spend a little time looking out of your window or keep an eye out when you go for a walk, how many cars pass you? Can you count them?	Can you design your very own car or truck? You could draw it or make it from junk modelling.	Have a go at the weekly challenge that will be set on Facebook.	
Talk about the story with an adult. What has happened to the truck? Who tries to help him? Can you hear any words that sound the same?	How many animals try and help Duck?	If you have any toy cars at home, you could maybe dip the wheels in some paint and make some track marks on paper.	Do some exercise together, how about starting with ten star jumps? Can you feel your heart beating?	
Who is your favourite character? Can you draw a picture of them and try to write their name?	Using some Lego or other building blocks, you could make your own muddy puddle, how big will you make it/ can it be even bigger? How will the animals get through it? Might they need a bridge?	If you have any plastic toy animals, you could put them in a bucket of soapy water and give them a wash!	Listen to some different genres of music on YouTube - which is your favourite?	
Work with an adult to think of some rhyming pairs, say them out loud repeated, e.g. hat and cat, chair and bear, coat and boat.	If you have the space, you could set up a mini-mud kitchen outside, a tray of mud and some spoons and cups would be great! How many scoops of mud does it take to fill the cup?	To work on your finger strength, you could try to tie some knots in a piece of shoelace or rope, just like in the story.	Watch Mr Tumble on CBeebies - Can you learn a new Makaton sign?	
Talk to an adult about other forms of transport, e.g. aeroplanes, motorcycles or even hot air balloons.	Have a go at some online mats games at: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths- games/3-5-years/counting	Sing 5 little ducks when swimming one day, can you count backwards all the way from 5?	Play a board game or complete a jigsaw.
