Are the following statements true or false?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Evaporation is the process of a solid changing to a liquid.</li> <li>Water has to be boiling for it to evaporate.</li> <li>Water freezes at -1°C.</li> </ol> <p>When a liquid turns into gas, the particles in the material move slower.</p> <p>High Jump. You will need lots of cushions and a clear, safe place. Warm up by jogging on the spot for 1 minute, doing 10 star jumps and 10 squats.</p> <p>Place one cushion on the floor and jump over it (bend your knees as you jump and land). Add another cushion to the pile and jump over both of them. Swing your arms as you jump to help you get high. Continue to add cushions as you clear the jump, you may need to introduce a run up as the pile gets higher.</p>	<p>Using your family name, use the letters to make as many different words as you can.
