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| <p><u>Introduce yourself to Mrs Graham</u> Mrs Graham is going to be your teacher in Y1 so today draw a careful picture of yourself and write a sentence to tell her something about yourself. EG I like..... or I am good at.... Don't forget to impress her with your neatest handwriting!</p> | <p><u>Sun roll and colour game.</u> Draw maybe 50 sun shapes onto a piece of paper. Do the same on another piece of paper. Take turns to roll a dice and colour in the number of suns rolled. Who will be first to colour all their suns?</p> | <p><u>Think about what you are looking forward to</u> Think about something that you are looking forward to doing when we eventually all get back to school. Draw a picture or make a model about this.</p> | <p><u>Set up an obstacle course</u> You sent me some fabulous photos of obstacle courses in your gardens right back at the start of your home learning. Can you now set up another one that is even bigger and better than the first?</p> |
| <p><u>Have a trip down memory lane</u> Try to remember something that you have really enjoyed during the last school year. It might be something we did in school or you will more likely remember something you have enjoyed whilst learning from home. Draw a picture of that memory and write a sentence about it.</p> | <p><u>Learn some doubles</u> Try to learn the doubles facts to double 5 ie 1+1, 2+2, 3+3, 4+4 & 5+5 = If you want a challenge try to learn some with bigger numbers too.</p> | <p><u>Make a sun safety poster</u> Find out about ways to keep safe in the sun. Can you make a poster to let other people know what they should do? You should include things like drink water, put on sun cream & wear a sun hat.</p> | <p><u>Skim some stones</u> Next time you are walking near some water have a go at skimming stones or simply just throwing one in and listening for the splash!</p> |
| <p><u>Sing the alphabet song</u> Sing the alphabet song together - this is saying the letter names rather than their sounds. Write each of the letters of the alphabet as a capital and a lower case on separate pieces of paper. Spread all the pieces of paper out on the floor and try to match the capitals and lower case letters back together again.</p> | <p><u>Say the number one less than</u> Go back to this tricky task. This week put numbers to 10 or 20 up on the fence or chalk them onto the ground. Get your water pistol (or a wet sponge) and splat the number one less than the one said.</p> | <p><u>Make a pair of flip flops</u> Using card and pipe cleaners can you make a pair of flip flops for the summer? See the picture for an idea to get you started.</p>  | <p><u>Decorate a biscuit</u> Use a plain biscuit such as Rich Tea and then use icing sugar, sprinkles and any other goodies you may have in your kitchen cupboard to decorate a smiley face biscuit - one for each person in your house. Enjoy eating them together!</p> |
| <p><u>Speed test your tricky word knowledge</u> Go to www.phonicsplay.co.uk and using the free user name and password select the tricky words trucks game and see how quickly you can read the tricky words you have been learning (either phase 2, 3 or 4 or 5.)</p> | <p><u>Play the answer is 10</u> The answer is 10. How many different number sentences can you write where the answer is 10. Eg 5+5 = 10, 9+1=10 Have 10 objects to hand to help you. If this is too tricky make the answer 5 or if you want a challenge try to include some subtraction sentences too eg 12-2 =10</p> | <p><u>Sing along and have fun</u> Join in with this well known song. If you keep going to the end you will get a chance to maybe use some of the different ways to say hello we learnt a few weeks ago! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=71hgRT9U0wg</p> | <p><u>Camp out</u> We might not be able to go far for our holidays this summer so why not choose a night when it's not too cold and put a tent up in the garden if you have one and sleep out overnight. If you don't have a tent why not set up camp under the dining room table for a change!</p> |
| <p><u>Write a list of things to do.</u> Use your phonic knowledge to write a list of things you would like to try and do during the six weeks holiday.</p> | <p><u>Make a numberline</u> How many numbers can you write in order? Can you write numbers to 10? To 20? Or can you go even higher? Use your best number formation.</p> | <p><u>Complete an act of kindness</u> This week don't forget to say thank you to the grown ups who have been helping you to complete your home learning tasks.</p> | <p><u>Repeat a favourite family fun task</u> Choose one of the family fun activities that you have particularly enjoyed and do it again!</p> |
