




Home Learning Grid

Read the story of The Hungry Caterpillar.	How many items of food did the Hungry Caterpillar eat?	Try a new food, something you have never tried before!	Make some fruit kebabs. Can you make you kebab into a pattern?
Paint some pasta or some cheerios (anything that you can thread) and thread these onto a piece of string to make you own caterpillar on a string!	Why not make a caterpillar using finger paints. Paint each of your fingers and print them onto paper, making the shape of a caterpillar. How many parts are there to your caterpillar?	Can you make your very own Caterpillar using an egg carton and some paint? An adult might have to help you with the cutting, it can be a bit tricky! Draw a picture of all of your favourite foods. Can you label any of them?	 <p>Can you count the number of fruits on each row?</p>	Fill a balloon halfway, tie a knot in the balloon. Use the bottom of the balloon to print some shapes, what shape do you see?	Does the Hungry Caterpillar eat healthy food or unhealthy food? Maybe a bit of both? Plan out some healthy meals to have at home?
Re-tell the story of the Hungry Caterpillar yourself, Use the pictures to help you.		Sing our 'tiny caterpillar on a leaf song', how much of it can you remember?	Place some food items in a box, take turns to blindfold each other. Can you feel the food to guess what it is?
Try some scissor practice! Draw some nice green leaves and cut them out.	Have a go at writing numbers 1-5.	Create a bug hotel.	Make some popcorn, can you hear the popping sound?
