Today you will be explorers and scientists. You will be going outside to find, map and draw some minibeast habitats. You will need a pencil, a piece of paper and something hard to lean on.

Go on a hunt around the house and also the garden to see if you can find any minibeasts. Mark on your map where you found them and draw a picture of the habitat. There is a worksheet in TEAMS if you would prefer to use one.

Was it dark or light?

Was it underneath something or hanging from something?

Was it wet or dry?

Look for woodlouse, spiders, worms, beetles etc.

Write a sentence underneath each picture to explain where the creature was found and what the habitat was like, e.g. the spider was on a web and it was in a dry, dark and dusty shed.
